On the international front, the PIPA 2013 contemporary art award has selected RU as residency host in 2014 for the winner of the PIPA award.

RU PUBLIC PROGRAMS

RU Talk: "Held in Trust: Indeterminate forms", Emily Zimmerman and Allison Berkoy in discussion



Wednesday July 17th, 2013, 6:30 pm - Free and open to the public Residency Unlimited 360 Court Street #4 (big green doors) Brooklyn, NY 11231

This discussion continues a two-year research project and the series of interviews led by curator Emily Zimmerman, focusing on the role of trust in artistic practices that test the boundaries between installation, performance, and participatory art. Works that move nimbly between performance and installation challenge viewers to operate outside of known codes for behavior. These situations are often riddled with an anxiety of participation, placing pressure on the tacit trust between the viewer and the artist. In August 2012, Zimmerman had moderated a panel discussion on this topic at RU with David Levine, Annie Dorsen and RU artists Irina Baldini and Masako Matsushita.

In this new talk, artistAllison Berkoy and Zimmerman will confront a hybridized terrain called forth in Berkoy's interactive installations, and explore the unique opportunities and limitations in creating environments that are driven by ambiguity and unresolved multiplicity. Berkoy's multidisciplinary forms draw heavily on her background in theater, and position the spectator within an ever shifting set of relations on multiple scales. In the course of the evening, they will discuss Berkoy's work through the notion of polyopia, defined medically as a disordered perceptual experience of multi-vision, suggested through Berkoy's work as a "re-ordered conceptual experience of additive uncertainty."

RU Event: A screening of 9 videos and short films by Croatian artist Ana Bilankov

Cities, landscape, displacement, in-between spaces and the construction of identity are central themes to Ana Bilankov's work. They correspond with social and political or historic context of the place in which they are realized, concurrently reflecting on the inner psychological conditions, experiences, personal stories and traumas of a specific locality.

Tonight's screening spans almost a decade of Bilankov's production. She will discuss her manifold approaches to subject matter and working methods with RU's program director Boshko Boskovic.
