The exhibition <code>Double Prosecco</code> brings together works by <code>Joëlle Lehmann</code> and <code>José Moñú</code> – two artists currently participating in the Residency Unlimited program. For the Ace Hotel New York gallery, the artists have conceived a site-specific installation, playfully merging their distinctive practices of photography and painting to evoke an ambiance reflecting their encounters with New York City. The richness of the city's visual and audio stimuli, its constant flux and exhilarating rhythm is echoed in both the bountiful installation as well as the exhibition's title, <code>Double Prosecco</code>, a humorous metaphor for the sensory and mental overload one often encounters on the New York City streets. This exhibition is curated by <code>Zeljka Himbele</code>, Guest Curator at Residency Unlimited.


