RU is thrilled to present new work by artists and team members **Marco Michel** (Residency Coordinator) and **Tom Lescure** (Residency Program Intern) in their duo show *How to Disappear, Ways of Showing Up*, a painting exhibition that interrogates the expression of existence, presence, and anonymity. The artists strongly embody the duality of taking place and hiding, a constant tension between visibility and invisibility. Whether thrust into the spotlight, forcibly or voluntarily, the characters seem to be hidden behind anonymous realities, disappearing into a silent everyday life. Masks fall or take their place, and the canvases impose their presence upon us. What a strange eclipse. How does one find their place, on which side of the curtain should one stand to play their role in the theater of life? *How to Disappear, Ways of Showing Up* invites each visitor to reflect on their own existence and the ways they choose to show up or hide.

PLAYA's free Awarded Residencies are open to the global community of scientists and artists whose work promotes dialogue and positive change in the environment and the world. We encourage naturalists, biologists, musicians, designers, sustainability leaders, social practitioners, musicians, visual artists, writers, performing artists, and collaborators and individuals engaged in interdisciplinary work or other forms of creative work to apply.

Deadline: July 15, 2024 (11:59 pm MDT)

Artists-in-residence enjoy uninterrupted time and space to focus on the creative process: private studios, meals by a professional chef, a \$1,500 stipend, and the experience of the majestic High Plains on a 20,000-acre ranch in Wyoming. The application fee is \$40.

Elizabeth Foundation for the Arts SHIFT Residency for Arts Workers

Deadline: July 31, 2024

Each year six New York-based artists receive a shared studio space, artist honoraria and production fee, career development opportunities, group catalog production, as well as monthly peer critiques and guest studio visits. The residency period starts from January 2025, and ends in July 2025, culminating in a curated group exhibition at EFA Project Space.
