Leave the Community Alone is a research project by curator Isabella Indolfi centered around the politics and the ethics of "community art" in rural contexts. By way of a journey to remote and depopulated villages in Italy, Russia, Iceland and the United States, the fieldwork is comprised of four case studies of art residencies and festivals, each activating a critical exchange between villagers and artists and triggering problematic power dynamics of representation.

# RU Meet Over Lunch: <u>A Presentation by Elisa</u> <u>Bertaglia and Gabriele Grones</u>

Brooklyn-based Italian artists Elisa Bertaglia and Gabriele Grones present their work made during their recent artist residencies at RU. Elisa Bertaglia analyzes the processing of mourning through artistic practice, starting from the study of ancient Korean epitaphs preserved at the Brooklyn Museum to create a series of highly symbolic paintings and works. Gabriele Grones' research focuses on the connections between different cultures. His paintings stem from his study of the symbolism of Native American sacred plants, their meanings, and their presence in different artistic traditions.


RU Exhibition: Transposing comic cartoons, female bodies, witches, goddesses, daughters, <u>artists</u>

RU presents the works of six international artists who spent the last three months developing their practices in NYC: Sarah-Mecca Abdourahman (Canada), Sophia Bakos (Canada), Hoda Kashiha (Iran), Ana Likar (Slovenia), Kejoo Park (Korea/Germany), Tharini Sankarasubramanian (India). Curated by RU Artistic Director Lu Solano.

Displaced from other societies and their ideological frameworks, each of the featured artists respond to a new context around them. Analogously to transposing music, artists may restate their works at a different pitch level. If we'd rather consider (visual) language, transposition offers the opportunity to reconfigure content from a source language to a new one, with room for (creative) in-between space.






# RU Talk: <u>Giant Hogweed: From Eradication to</u> <u>Nourishment, from Struggle to Care with Adam</u> Vackar




# RU Performance: <u>Feet of the World in Action by Ana Biolchini</u>






RU Talk: 2024 NYC-Based Artist Residency Talk on Nature of Being Exhibition




### **RU Exhibition:** The House of Confluence: Bricolage

In August 2024, The House of Confluence presents the group exhibition, <u>Bricolage</u>, showcasing the works of five RU artists: Cecilia Barreto (Mexico), Shia Roan Conlon (Finland), Gjorgji Despodov (North Macedonia), R.B van Heesch (Netherlands), and David Přílučík (Czech Republic). This exhibition is curated by RU Guest Curator Data Chigholashvili. Through different topics and approaches found in the artworks, this exhibition proposes a diversity in worldmaking. In this bricolage, we find revisiting symbols and charts, representing personal or imaginary worlds, addressing less-known stories, and exploring fragments of reliefs or landscapes aspects that flow and differently emerge in the works, creating interconnections concerning the complexity of how we make the (sense of) world around us.

Artists <u>Krasimira Butseva</u> (current RU resident) and <u>Julian Chehirian</u> discuss their work on <u>The Neighbours</u>—a multimedia installation about how we remember, carry and forget trauma—currently on view at the National Pavilion of Bulgaria at the <u>60th Venice Biennale</u>. Through the interplay of video projections, ambient sounds, and artifacts recovered from the former sites of Bulgarian state violence, the installation visually juxtaposes the material world of labor camps with the space of the home, evoking how traumatic memories permeate daily life while inviting the audience to bear witness.




## RU Meet Over Lunch: Flávia Dalla Bernardina and the Art Scene in Vitória

Living Room Portfolio is conceived as an experimental exhibition, which reflects on residencies and incorporates the open studio format. In this experimental format, studios extend through the exhibition spaces, and selected materials of resident artists are presented in the "living room areas." On Saturdays (Sept. 14 and 21), selected participating artists will be the hosts in the space – while their works will be on display in the exhibition, visitors will have additional possibilities to view the artists' portfolios, which will unfold throughout the exhibition setting itself and create possibilities for engagement and discussions.
