Old Hope at Mendes Wood DM

In his first solo New York show, Paulo Nazareth (2017 RU alum) brings together a

wide range of works that question aspects of Brazilian art history including the commercialisation resulting from the genocide of Brazilian indigenous peoples; the relationship between immigrants and the urban environment.

TECTONIC SHIFTS at The Something Machine 11 Station Road, Bellport, New York 11713 On view until July 10, 2022

Ai Makita's (2017 RU alum) presents two immersive, hyperreal painted abstractions that engulf the corners of the gallery space, revealing a visible void, a portal and a "way through". An exploration into the repercussions of industrial progress on sentience and the natural world. An inquiry into the impact of geological, hydrological and meteorological forces on the Japanese consciousness that looms large.

Five Times Brazil at the New Museum 235 Bowery, New York, NY 10002 June 30 - October 16, 2022

Bárbara Wagner (2018 RU alum) and Benjamin de Burca produce since a decade films and video installations that feature protagonists engaged in cultural production.

Five Times Brazil presents five projects developed by the artists over a period of particular socio-political turmoil in Brazil. Curated by Margot Norton and Bernardo Mosqueira.



Walking on Dry Land at The Laurie M. Tisch Gallery 334 Amsterdam Ave, New York, NY 10023 On view until Aug 28, 2022

A site-specific installation by **Rotem Reshef** (2021 RU alum) with two islands of color and texture that suggest a site of refuge. These paintings offer a dual perspective of an inner world mirroring an exterior landscape, arresting in time the cycle of seasons. A suggestion that painting can shift modes, expand and modify our perception, like a story unfolding.

Opportunities

NYSCA/NYFA – Artists with Disabilities Grant

Deadline: June 28, 2022

The program will distribute \$1,000 to New York State artists with a disability who reside outside of the five boroughs of NYC. The grant will be open to visual, media, music, performing, literary, and multidisciplinary artists. Applicants will need to be practicing artists and be able to demonstrate an ongoing commitment to their arts practice and career.

ISSUE Project Room – 2023 Suzanne Fiol Curatorial Fellowship Deadline: July 8, 2022

This program supports an emerging, New York-based curator with a \$3,000 stipend, a budget to produce three public programs during the 2023 season, free access to rehearsal space, professional development opportunities, and more.

The Fullerton – Building Shells: Building Community

Deadline: July 11, 2022

Open Call for a site-specific commission for a building shell located in Newburgh, NY. One artist (or collective) will be selected to receive \$10,000. The date and duration of the work will be proposed by the artist and confirmed in coordination with the team and the City of Newburgh. The commission should be completed by Spring 2023.

Art Omi: Artists 2023 Critic in Residence Open Call Deadline: July 15, 2022

For the next session taking place June 23 - July 17, 2023, two critics/curators are invited to the program to facilitate discussions, help connect the artists with art world professionals through the Visitors Program, and conduct individual studio visits with the 23 artists in residence. A travel grant, \$1,500 honorarium, private bedroom, workspace and meals are provided.
