Dedicated to artists who are traditionally underrepresented in the arts, RU's NYC-Based Artist Residency Program is accepting applications from artists who identify as Black, Indigenous and People of Color, with research-based practices that bridge gaps in historical knowledge. Four artists will be selected for a three-month residency, taking place from **April 3 - June 30, 2023**.

Criteria:

- RU welcomes applications from BIPOC artists working across media
- Artists have a research-based practice that bridges gaps in historical knowledge
- Artists live in one of the five boroughs
- The artist has a valid social security number
- Matriculated students are not eligible
- Please note that this program does not offer studio space

The 2023 NYC-Based Artist Residency features:

- \$3,300 stipend
- \$500 production support
- Weekly one-on-one visits with guest curators/critics, including meetings with guest curator Rachel Raphaela Gugelberger, the RU team and invited art professionals
- Activities with international artist resident community including artist presentations, a monthly salon and field trips
- Project/production assistance
- A culminating group exhibition at PS122 Gallery in the East Village, June 5 June 27, 2023

A striking 13.5-foot-long mixed media collage by Damali Abrams the Glitter Priestess (2021-2022 RU alum) will be on view at Zuckerman Institute's Education Lab on 129th Street. Damali was particularly inspired by the spectrograms and histograms—special charts and graphs—that she encountered during conversation with ZI's scientists.

Eve K. Tremblay (2010 RU alum) is part of this group show alongside 16 other artists, all whom are either based in Montreal or represented there in local galleries and museums. On view are Tremblay's "photo-pebbles"—small porcelain pieces imprinted with photographed scenes of Lake Champlain—which connects her homeland with the Adirondacks, where the artist now lives.

"Getsemani" by Gabriella Ciancimino (2019 RU alum) is a site specific project that narrates a visionary garden through signs and iconographies. The exhibition is part of "Level 0", the ArtVerona initiative in collaboration with fourteen Italian contemporary art institutions, which aims to promote emerging artists.

Opportunities

Art in the Parks: Alliance for Flushing Meadows Corona Park Grant

Deadline: January 22, 2023

Supports the creation of two site-specific artworks by Queens-based artists for designated locations within Flushing Meadows Corona Park. Each grantee will receive an award of \$10,000 to create their proposed artwork.

Sharpe-Walentas Studio Program

Deadline: January 31, 2023

Awards rent-free non-living studio space to 17 visual artists for year-long residencies in DUMBO, Brooklyn. Open to professional visual artists, 21 years or older who live in the US, as well as US citizens or permanent residents living abroad.

Fine Arts Work Center - Visual Arts Fellowship

Deadline: February 1, 2023

Offers seven-month residencies to a juried group of emerging visual artists. Includes apartment, a studio, and a monthly stipend of \$1,250 plus an exit stipend of \$1,000. Each Visual Art Fellow is given a solo exhibition opportunity. \$65 application fee.

Artadia – 2023 Los Angeles Awards

Deadline: February 1, 2023

Each year Artadia launches open calls in each of the seven active partner cities. Currently accepting applications from visual artists based in LA County. Includes unrestricted grants of \$15,000, and awardees can participate in the Artadia Network as well as receive a dedicated webpage on Artadia's online Artist Registry.
