*Encounter* by the RU local artist **Roxane Revon** presents an "evolutive" solo exhibition aimed at engaging a dialogue between Governors Island's active layers of life and matter and the artist's own intimate experience of the place. Working in a studio space at the KODA/RU house, Revon looks at transforming the instability of outdoor conditions and in-progress work into an aesthetical experiment that welcomes precarity, movement and spontaneity. Inspired by Walter Benjamin's "tikkum olam" concept, which, in Judaism, refers to an action intended to repair and improve the world, Revon's resulting exhibition will evolve over the course of a few weeks as it deconstructs the land's elements (endemic seeds, rocks, minerals, wood, organic waste) and rebuilds it in experimental artworks that will transform the space.



*Time Travel* is a durational performance by the RU artist **Paola Fernanda Guzmán Figueroa** that takes place on Governors Island. Lasting 45-60 minutes, the starting point is the Governors Island Welcome Center from where the artist will depart with a small aquarium that contains water and her hair. The public on the island will be invited to follow her trajectory to the KODA/RU House. Through actions such as transporting the aquarium, and using a plastic hose, Paola's intention is to explore the emotions of longing and the desire for reviving past life as air and life are infused into the contained hair.

### Peters Valley School of Craft–Maxwell/Hanrahan Guest Artist Residencies

### Deadline: August 1, 2023

Open to artists who work in blacksmithing, ceramics, fibers, fine metals, wood, drawing/painting/collage, or printmaking. Fully funded guest artist residencies in October and November which includes fully equipped studios, a private room in a fully furnished shared house, and a \$500 stipend for two-week long residencies and \$1,000 stipend for month-long residencies.

### SculptureCenter 2024 In Practice Open Call

### Deadline: August 6, 2023

Annual open call for artists who have not yet had an institutional solo exhibition in New York City. Applicants can submit proposals for solo exhibitions with production budgets of up to \$6,000. Up to seven artists will be selected to participate and will receive separate \$1,000 honorariums.

### CaribBeing Governors Island Artist Residency : Curren\$ea

### Deadline: August 14, 2023

Caribbeing invites NYC-based visual artists who identify as Caribbean/LatinX to apply for a 6-week residency. Artists who work across media and whose practices are research-based and geared towards filling in gaps in cultural and historical knowledge are encouraged to apply. Residency does not provide studio space and students are not eligible to apply.
